DANNY KLEINMAN will be making a rare appearance in the Midwest at this tournament as Honorary Chairman. This appearance means you have a chance to meet this well-known author of 9 backgammon books and respected backgammon analyst. The format for this tournament will be 'true' double elimination (DEF) with progressive consolation. A player can lose one match and still win his division. Some other advantages of this format are all wins advance a player closer to a winning position and 3 losses are required to be eliminated. Besides the familiar 64 and 32 DEF, 48 DEF has been devised to minimize the large number of byes with 33 to 48 players.



The format guaranteed 10 matches with the 4 players having the best win-loss record advancing to the semifinals. Most players reported they liked the guarantee of 10 matches but would like to see longer matches. A side note: in other formats, the seeds usually take high percentage of the win places, but in this format only one seed made it to the semifinals both times it has been used.

Here is your chance to win and all you have to do is to make a list. Backgammon, like most games, has it's own vocabulary. Some words, like "back", appear repeatedly. sample list for "back" is

- "back gammon the name of the game. 1)
- 2) "back"gammon losing a game with piece(s) in opponent's home board.
- 3) "back" piece(s) the piece(s) farthest from home board.
 4) "back" game a type of game holding point(s) in opponent's home board The word that seems to appear most often in backgammon is "DOUBLE". The contest is to produce a list, like with "back", for the word "DOUBLE." The list must contain your phrases along with a short description for each phrase. The person sending in the longest accepted list will receive \$2 off their entry fee to the 2nd INDIANA CLASSIC for each phase. With a list of 10, the winner would receive \$20 off. Send your list to 'HBC - Double List' &Butch Meese by October 20th. As a starting point, HBC came up The winner, along with the winning list, will be with a list of over a dozen. announced in the November newsletter. The winner must attend the 2nd INDIANA CLASSIC to receive the reduced entry fee. It is not transferable. If the winner does not attend the 2nd INDIANA CLASSIC, he will receive a Lucite doubling cube.

Joe Sylvester versus Jeff Hodges

A program 'Backgammon BEAROFF Simulator' was used to obtain the percentages and averages. The program runs on the IBM-PC, ATT-PC or compatible and will be available late this or early next year. If you are interested in obtaining information on this program, send your name and address to 'HBC - BEAROFF' %Butch Meese, 7620 Kilmer Lane, Indianapolis, IN 46256. Be sure to indicate which computer system you have if different than the IBM or ATT personnel computer.

Before Joe rolled 6-1, he was 59.7% to win. With a roll of 6-1, the 6 is moved off and there are two choices on the one. Both positions after moving the 1's were run with the same dice rolls to 30,000 games. The move of 5 to 4 produces a better chance to win (2.53 average rolls) than moving 2 to 1 (2.57 average rolls). To show how this relates to winning percentage in this game, both positions were run against Jeff's position with Jeff on roll. By moving 5-4, Joe's position would be 55.0% to win and moving 2-1, he would be 51.7%.
