Another successful Indiana Open with long shots, 16 cubes and a good time for all. The 34th Indiana Open, held March 21st to 23rd at Sheraton Inn - East had one match decided with a 16 cube and tournament winner, Mike Keener, lost in the first round and then won 9 straight matches to capture his first title. After his first round loss, Mike's chances of winning the tournament were 1 in 512 - a real long shot. Three local players, RON BLACK, CYRUS MOBED and WALTER WALLACE made their mark. WALTER and RON finished first, second respectively in the Novice Division while CRYUS won the Intermediate Jackpot. Backgammon parents are teaching their children well. Father Dean Muench took second in the Open Division while son Kevin placed second in the Novice consolation. Also, father Greg Varbinov captured second in the Intermediate while son Bob won the Novice Consolation. Jeff Kane, who won the Novice Division last fall in the Classic, won the Intermediate Division. At this rate, it will not be long before he tries his skills in the Open Division. And you Indianapolis players watch out! Cassie Curtis, Jim Curtis's 11 year old daughter, said she truly enjoyed her first tournament and shows promise.


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
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
To Double or Not To Double

Answers: "To Double or Not To Double"

The most important factors about these no-miss bearoff positions is which side is on-roll and the number of pieces left on each side. In even positions, both sides having the same number of pieces, being on-roll is a big advantage as in Positions #1 and #2. In uneven positions, the number of rolls to bearoff needs to be counted to determine who favored. In positions, the number of rolls to bearoff needs to be counted to determine who favored. In counting the number of rolls, having a odd number is just like having the next highest even number of pieces. In Position \$2, "O" has 10 pieces and "O" has 9 pieces, but both will average the same number of rolls to bearoff. It is not the same as in Position \$3. "O" has 11 pieces and "O" has 10. Because "O" has 11 pieces which is like having 12, it will take one more roll to bearoff. This explans why "O" is favored in Position \$3. Position \$1 1) "O" is 70.6% and it is a double. "O" is 29.4% and has a take. Position \$2 1) "O" is also 72.6%. Plays the same as if "O" is on-roll.

Position \$3 1) "O" on roll with 37.1% to win and it is not a double. "O" has a beaver.

2) "O" on roll with 93.5% to win and has a double. "O" has a drop.

"O" needs 5 or less rolls to bearoff and "O" needs 6 or less and being
