



Positition #1 ll Point Match X-10, O-10 X to Play 11? (X has a piece on the bar)



Position #2 ll Point Match X-4, 0-9O doubles to 2? As X what do you do?



<u>Problem #1 - Match Game, X to Play 1-1?</u>

Since it is match game, either side just needs to win the game to win the match. Double l's is a good roll for X (16 numbers danced)! The first action is to enter on O's 1 point. With double 1's, in most positions there are a lot of options. In this position, X must find a way to reduce O's opportunities to cover his pieces on the 20 or 18 points and make this prime. Therefore X must hit O on the 2 point. This hit takes away half of O's next roll to reenter from the bar. Danny Kleinman points out that the 2-point is inferior to the 3-point, but the hit is more important. The last checker should be moved to the 14 point. Thanks to Tom Walthes(Chicago) for providing the problem and Danny Kleinman for his insight.

Problem #2 - 11 Point Match O-9, X-4 O Doubles to 2? As X, What do you do? When way behind in a match score, when does one take and turn the cube right back? If you pass, you will be 4-10 (crawford game) or 8.3% to win the match. In this position, X will be (155/1296 or 11.9%) to win the game without the cube. If X takes and O does not roll doubles to win, he can redouble to 4. If this all happens, X would still be trailing 8-9 (or 40.3%). So what determines what is best for X? According to Danny Kleinman, the ratio of match equity risked (8.3%) to maximum win-loss swing if X takes (40.3%) is the minimum chance needed to justify the take (8.3/40.3 = 20.6%). So to take trailing 4-9 to 11, you need 20.6% equity in the game and since X is only 11.9% - it is a drop! Thanks to Jim Curtis(Indianapolis) for providing the problem and again to Danny Kleinman for his analysis.
