WORLD CUP & Eastern Open


Kent Goulding's U.S. Invitational has grown to THE WORLD CUP. THE WORLD CUP is an invitational tournament with the best of the 'WORLD' along with winners of special qualifying tournaments to be run during regional tournaments all over the country. THE WORLD CUP will be a 32-player single-elimination tournament with an entry fee of \$3500. Qualifying tournaments are now scheduled for the 36th INDIANA OPEN during March and Michigan Summer Championships in July; check with the Hoosier Backgammon Club and Flint Area Backgammon for details. The WORLD CUP is scheduled for August 3-7th in Boston, along with the Eastern Open.

Interesting Positions From the 4th INDIANA CLASSIC

Position #1 - 11 Point Match

Score: X-6 O-3

O doubles to 8? As X what do you do?




Position #1

In an 11 point match, O had the cube at 4 and was about to be gammoned and lose the match when a blot was produced. O quickly seized the opportunity to redouble to 8 and has nothing to lose by doing so. With O's closed board, X can see a BIG swing on this next roll all the way to losing the match. In the heat of a match, swings like this have to be dealt with and X has to decide what to with this double. Without the pressures of the tournament, let us look at this closer. If X drops, the score will be 6 to 7 (or 41% of X) and needs more than that to justify a take. It's easier to calculate O's chances because the only way O can win is by hitting X's blot this turn or later. If X takes, the match is on the line with this game. O hits 16 of 36 rolls this turn and will be greater than 68% to win this game and the match. (Note: the 68% is calculated from the fact X would be 32% against a closed board with one piece up and no misses bearing off after entering). If O misses on this turn, O will have chances on his next turn but takes too much space here to detail (it is available upon request). A short summary shows that O will have no blot on 13/36 of X's rolls, single blot on 17/36 and a double shot on 6/36. What the calculations do show is that O's match equity is 30.0% (16/36 X 68%) on his first turn plus 17.6% on his next turn or 47.6%. What can be estimated from this is that it is close for X to drop or take. When it is close like this, X has to decide to put the match on the line by taking and completing this game or by dropping and playing from the score of 6 to 7. This is what makes backgammon the intriguing game it is.

Position #2 - 9 Point Match Score: X-3 O-7

O on roll. As O do you double? If O doubles, what do you do as X?



Position #2 From Marc Gray, Mayfield, NY.

Dear Folks, Here is my solution to Problem #2 from your December newsletter. I must first compliment you on the 2 excellent problems that you have chosen for presentation this month. The solutions that I came up with are both surprising to me, and that's what makes them so elegantly didactic. Keep up the fine work. I am certain that it is much appreciated by more people than you realize.

And now for my solution: O should double and X should drop! "BEAROFF" computer simulation generates 77% winning chances for O. If O refrains from doubling O's match equity is computed as follows:

Game Outcome x Score = Equity O Wins 77% O Lose 23% x 8-3 (90%) x 7-4 (75%) = 69.3%= 17.3%Total Match Equity 86.6%

If O doubles and X drops, O's match equity becomes 90%. If O doubles and X takes, the match equity computes as follows:

= Equity = 77.0% Game Outcome Score x 9-3(100%) O Wins 77% O Lose 23% O Lose 23% x 7-5 (68%) Total Match Equity 92.6%. = 15.6%

Clearly O profits by doubling, irrespective of X's response, gaining 3.7% where X drops and gaining 6.0% when X takes. If X follows the preferred course of action and drops, her match equity will be 10.0% and 7.4 to take. It is 13.4% in the event that O fails to double.

Side Notes: In Position #1, X dropped and won the match. In Position #2, O did not double, rolled double 5's to send the match to the Crawford Game and lost the match.
