Over a hundred players converged on Indianapolis for the 36th INDIANA OPEN. The highlight of the weekend was the two World Cup Qualifiers which were won by Wendy "The Girl" Kaplan (NY) and Alan Steffen (WA). In the Open Division, a strong field of players saw Bob Holyon get a first round bye, lose in the second round and then <drum roll> won 9 straight matches including two against Alan Steffen in the finals. An unique feat in-deed! Another unique feat was that husband, Paul Franks, captured the Intermediate top spot while wife, Mary Franks, won the Novice Division. Looks like the Franks family should have entered someone in the Open Division. HBC donated an Intermediate Division Entry into the 36th INDIANA OPEN for Operation Feed based in Columbus, OH which raised nearly \$300 and was won by John Bath. Players were asked to filled out a questionaire and HBC rewarded two players by random draw. The winners, Karen Davis (Washington, DC) and Mick Dobratz (Indianapolis), won \$40 off their entry fee for the 5th INDIANA CLASSIC to be held in the fall. Many thanks to those who took the time to fill out the questionaire. The results of the questions including feedback on the Holland Rule will be published in the HBC's national mailing for the 5th INDIANA CLASSIC. Director's Notes: New players attending the İNDIANA tournaments are pleasantly surprised with the format used - true double elimination with progressive consolation. They are first intriqued by the complicated appearance of the grid but enjoy the fact that after two losses, they are still playing longer length matches than other formats. They also enjoy playing for a good share of the prize pool. This format will also be used at the Michigan Summer Championships in Flint, Michigan, July 22-24.



Game Note: With the position Corbett has on roll in move 27, he would average only 65 wins out of every 100,000 games. With the position Ballard has before rolling in move 27, he wins 97.7% of the time. And finally on move 28, Corbett wins on 3 rolls or 8.3%.



Answer to last month's problem! 5 Point Match, Score 0-0 Black doubles to 2? Does White have a take?

Some bearoff positions can look deceptive like this one. Although white has a close pip count, black has a big advantage with two more pieces off. With this big advantage in an otherwise even position, white needs 2 sets of doubles over what black rolls to win. Black is favored by 84% and if black had the 2 pieces that are off on the 1-point, he would still be favored by 64%.
