The Farah Rules for Chouettes.

The rules for tournament backgammon are fairly standard now but rules for chouette play are not. In Flint, Michigan, the chouette rules are printed on the chouette score sheet and are presented here. It is not subjected that you adopt these rules, but rather adopt a set of rules that all can agree with and have the list printed. If you have other chouette rules you use, pass them alone.

Rule 1. Beaver Rule.

In a chouette of four of more players, if a double is offered by the box and only one of the opposing players chooses to accept the double that player has to beaver the cube. The rule also applies to the box if individual cubes are being used. The rule applies regardless of the original value of the cube.

Rule 2. The captain will act for an absentee player.

The captain will act for any player who is not immediately present when a decision needs to be made. This includes but is not limited to cube decisions, settlements and choice of moves. No person, other than the current captain can act for an absent player.

Rule 3. Inactive player.

Any player who is not present at the beginning of a game will be made inactive unless otherwise expressly indicated by the player. An inactive player will be relegated to the bottom of the rotation list where he will remain until he returns to active participation in the chouette. An inactive player may be bumped by an active player wishing to come into the chouette.

Rule 4. To retain possession of the box.

To retain possession of the box, a player needs only to win the game, in actual play, regardless of any negative settlements or any lost cubes. The losing player is dropped to the bottom of the list. Any player(s) who may have won settlements or won cube decisions will be moved ahead of the losing player(s) in the rotation.

Rule 5. Admission to an ongoing chouette of four or less players.

No player, of good character, may be denied admission to an ongoing chouette, at the ongoing stakes, providing the new player enters the chouette at the bottom of the chouette list and that he observes all of the chouette rules.

Rule 6. Size and number of chouette(s).

Chouette shall be limited to five players only. If additional players wish to join an existing chouette of five players then the chouette shall be divided into two new chouettes as follows: The box to be and captain to be of the original chouette shall remain as box and captain. The remaining players in the chouette shall move as box, captain, and next up respectively into the new chouette. The new players will be added alternately to the newly formed chouettes keeping the chouette balanced in number where possible.
