



From suggestion to reality: Double's Tournament.

One of HBC's players asked one day "Why don't you have a Double's Tournament?" Well, on December 4th, HBC is holding its first one-day Double's Tournament at the Bombay Bicycle Club, 9111 North Michigan Road (317) 872-3446. The format will be either main with consolation or double-elimination depending on the number of entries. Please call the HBC Hotline if you plan to attend so we can get a good count save the late fee - be sure to let us know who your partner will be. The Open Doubles entry fee is \$100/team. If there is enough interest, a Limited Doubles will also be run - \$40/team. Final registration will start at 11 AM on day of tournament with public draw at 11:50 AM and play beginning at Noon (we are on EST now). Four-player knock-outs will start about 2PM and will run throughout the day. Entry for Open KO is \$25, Intermediate \$10 and Novice \$5. All events will be 90% return. No gammon points was be awarded for the double events.

Answer to key position in last month's newsletter.

In this position Bob Holyon (X) leads Kathy Bauder (O) 11 to 9 in a 13 point match. Does X have a double? If X doubles, does O have a take? What do you think? This answer was submitted by Dean Muench of Chicago. Dean states that X's give point is 72.9% and X is favored by 84.5% so it is a double at this score. He further said O's take point is 17% and is a drop with only 15.5%. Dean has developed formulas to calculate give and take points which were presented in HBC's February 1988 newsletter. Anyone who did not receive that newsletter, can request one and we will send it to you. HBC thanks Dean and the others who submitted an answer.

CONCEPTS in ACTION by Joe Sylvester

Very often I am confronted by players who ask about doubling positions and what the right action should be. Instead, they should be asking how to work out the answer. They should be weighing the main components of the situation in order to make a wise decision. Just what are components?

Concept-In-Actions #2: Every position can be evaluated in terms of pips (race), position (checker distribution), and vigorish (threats).

Basically, if a player has an advantage in two of these three components, then he should double. If the player doubled has an advantage in one the these conponents, he usually has a take. It's when the player doubled has a disadvantage in two components and is equal in the third that bonderline decisions occur.

Here are some simple examples:


In Position #1, O is down in pips, his position is undeveloped and his vigorish is very minimal. All he has is an anchor. X has a strong double and O should drop. This is a sucker double.


In Position #2, X has a slightly better position than O and X is ahead in the race. O has something to fight back with, however. O has an advanced anchor, good checker distribution, comparable board strength and some small priming possibilities. Here, X should double and O should take.

Keep in mind that in evaluating these component factors, the component must be relevant. For example, a player with 14 men on his ace-point and a checker caught behind a prime is clearly ahead in pips. Just as clearly. he has a drop.

So next time you're faced with a difficult cube decision, utilize C.I.A. #2 to aid your analysis. Perhaps it will simplify your choices.


