

Club Spotlight

The Chicago Bar Point Club was formed in May, 1983 by Bill Davis and Peter Kalba and currently meets every Tuesday at Pat's Pub, 4343 North Harlem at 7:00 PM and bimonthly on Sunday's at **Bagwells**, 4636 North Cumberland at 12:30 PM. Entry fee is \$10 (80% return) with an optional \$5 side pool (100% return). The average attendance is 30 with no membership or guest fee required. The club provides free lessons for beginners and beginners are spotted one or two points in a 7-point match to give them a sporting chance. All players compete through master points for Player of the Year and over \$600 in cash and merchandise awarded to the TOP 20. The club strongly promotes tournament play an individual may play on the side only 3 times a year without entering the tournament.

Each year, **BPC** directs the **Midwest Backgammon Championship**, scheduled this year for April 14, 15 and 16. The tournament features some unique side attractions - backgammon pinball, pig rolling and liar's dice and this year a new event, NACKGAMMON. Ten percent of the calcutta auction proceeds benefits the **The Anti-Cruelty Society of Chicago**.

Bill Davis is the editor of the Chicago Point. The Chicago Point is much more then a newsletter and borders on being a full-feature backgammon magazine. It features backgammon problems, a coming events calendar, tournament results, interesting articles and much more. This 8-page monthly is definitely worth the \$10/year subscription rate.

WORLD CUP Match Joe Sylvester versus Alan Steffen 37 Point SemiFinal Match

During 1989, this match will be presented in its entirety in this newsletter, 1 to 4 games each month. This month games 6 thru 9 are on the next page. Along with the 34 games, all the doubling positions will be presented. There are some both interesting and exciting games in this match between two of the best.

Instructions:


You will need a backgammon board to follow along. The board is numbered 1 to 24 with all points numbered based on the view of the player on roll. The home portion of the board is numbered 1-6. Bearing off is denoted as moving to the 0 'zero' point. Each player will always be moving from a higher to lower point with only the point(s) moved to used. To make it easier to follow, the larger number rolled is denoted first. In some situations where the smaller number rolled is forced, it will be presented first. An example: being on the BAR with a roll of 52 and the 5-point make and the 2-point open.

Abbreviations used are CB - Closed Board, EF - Entry Failure, NP - No Play Possible, x opponents piece was hit, 5^2 - superscribe denotes 2 or pieces moving to the same point; this example has 2 pieces moving to the 5 point.

In the doubling positions, Joe will be 'X' and Alan 'O' and are shown from Joe Sylvester's side of the board. Study those first before going through the games.

Match Comments

This match has many interesting positions and plays. If you have any comments, send them in and we will include them in upcoming newsletters. One comment received so far comes from Wendy Kaplan about the 2-2 play in Game 1, Move 8 by Joe. "I never saw the play Joe made and would have not considered it but agree it was the right play."
