

1989 Michigan Summer Backgammon Championships

A record crowd (212) converged on Flint, Michigan for the MICHIGAN Summer Backgammon Championships sponsored by EF Hutton and Michelob. Despite the mediocre accommodations, difficult air travel and packed playing area, Carol Joy Cole and staff, HBC's Mary Ann Meese and Woody Woodworth and Flint's John Carrico and Judy Field, ran the 2nd largest tournament in the country this year - a true compliment to one of the best directors in backgammon today. A special double-elimination grid was developed to handle the record 87 players in the Open Division. Overflow Intermediate and double events were added to accommodate the large crowd. HBC players who attended were Mick Dobratz, David Smith and Larry Strommen, but only Larry with partner Neil Kazaross was able to cash in the main doubles.

Those Old Rules

To give some appreciation for the rules we now follow, let's review some rules from the past. These come from the book, *Backgammon of Today* by John Longacre copyrighted 1930.

Rule #2) The men are set up so that the inner tables shall be nearest the light. Decision of position of light and choice of men shall be made by the player throwing the highest single die.

Rule #3) If, at any time during the game it is discovered that the men have been wrongly set up, play ceases, and that game is void.

Rule #7) The player must leave his dice upon the board until his play is complete. Should he pick them up before the completion of his play, the opponent may, at his option, declare the play void, and require the offender to replace the man or men moved, and to throw again.

Rule #11) Whenever a man has been moved from its position upon a point it must be played if possible.

Editor's note: Besides some of the rules being vague, there were no rules on tournament play.

WORLD CUP Match Joe Sylvester vs Alan Steffen 37 Point SemiFinal

During 1989, this match is being presented in this newsletter, 1 to 4 games each month and this month games 17, 18 and 19 are presented. Along with the 34 games, all the doubling positions will be included. There are some both interesting and exciting games in this match between two of the best.

Instructions: You will need a backgammon board to follow along. The board is numbered 1 to 24 with all points numbered based on the view of the player on roll. The home portion of the board is numbered 1-6. Bearing off is denoted as moving to the 0 'zero' point. Each player will always be moving from a higher to lower point with only the point(s) moved to used. To make it easier to follow, the larger number rolled is denoted first. In some situations where the smaller number rolled is forced, it will be presented first. An example: being on the BAR with a roll of 52 with the 5-point made and the 2-point open.

Abbreviations used are CB - Closed Board, EF - Entry Failure, NP - No Play Possible, x - opponents piece was hit, 5^2 - superscribe denotes 2 or more pieces moving to the same point; this example has 2 pieces moving to the 5 point. In the doubling positions, Joe will be dark checkers and Alan the light and are shown from Joe Sylvester's side of the board. Study those first before going through the games.

HBC Mailbox - World Cup Match Feedback


I really like your bulletin - with the features - especially the matches. We get to see how the best players play, even complete with mistakes. If it isn't irreverent to even think about such a thing!

For instance, July issue, Game 15, Move 15, Joe sez "TAKE"!? Aggression paid off. I usually do 200 [rollouts] - sometimes more - when I study a position. But here, the first 50 suggested that black lost 74 instead of 50 points - the break even point. Then, the second 50, he lost 80 (!) instead of 50. QUIT rolling. Big DROP!.


Then when Joe redoubles - next diagram - aggression paid off again! It is scary, but preliminary work suggests it is a not-too-hard Take!.


Game 17 - Move 4, O doubles to 2?




Game 18 - Move 7, Odoubles to 2?



Game 18 - Move 23, Odoubles to 4?




Game 19 - Move 7, ○ doubles to 2?
