HBC New Year's Resolution: To provide a more competitive and enjoyable backgammon atmosphere.

To fulfill this resolution, the following changes will take place starting Thursday, February 1st. First we will be playing at Grisanti's, just across the street from Dooley's, with a new starting time of 7:30 PM.

Second, we will diversify weekly play by offering 4 events. The social round-robin format will return with an entry fee of \$5.00. This format is a great vehicle to bring brand new players on board and bring former players back who enjoyed this format.

We will also offer an Open Division with an entry fee of \$20 and an Intermediate Division with an entry fee of \$10. The format for both events will be main flight with consolation to allow for completion by midnight. All matches will be to 7 points, including the consolation.

At the other end, some players want a higher action event and their desires are being fulfilled. We will run a Championship level single elimination \$100 entry event directed by Wendy Kaplan. The match length will be 9 points. It will be limited to 8 players with a pay-out of \$750 to a single winner with option to hedge.

We also plan more one-day tournaments; look for 5 to 6 this year with at least one to be a team or doubles tournament. The next scheduled one-day is February 18th at Grisanti's (details below).

These changes were formulated by talking to different players and have been received quiet favorably. Look for more new ideas in the coming months. Be sure to bring your board!

HBC Player of the Year & TOP TEN Results

The spot for the Player of the Year was up for grabs through the last event of the year. Woody started off hot in December with two first place finishes in a row to try to overcome being down just less than a point in second place behind Butch. The big showdown came in league play where they played for second and a chance at first. After 32 games, Butch won in the best 2 of 3 9-point matches. Neither managed to place in the last two weeks of regular play (despite Woody leaving his sick bed the 28th in a last futile attempt to pass Butch). Butch won the top spot by only 0.22 gammon points (see final gammon point standing page 2). Newcomers to the TOP TEN are Wendy Kaplan who has been only competing since August, Brian Nelson and David Smith. To celebrate, HBC will have a TOP TEN Awards Tournament February 18th.




33 Point QuarterFinal Match


This year the **HBC Newsletter** presents one of the quarter final matches from the first World Cup between twice world champion Bill Robertie and Ray Glaeser. World Cup II will be held in Boston, August 7-12. Qualifiers for World Cup II will be held across the country, including the 14th Bluegrass Regional (March 2-4), **38th INDIANA OPEN** (April 6-8) and Michigan Summer Championships (June 29-July 1).


Instructions: You will need a backgammon board to follow along. The board is numbered 1 to 24 with all points numbered based on the view of the player on roll. The home portion of the board is numbered 1-6. Bearing off is denoted as moving to the 0 'zero' point. Each player will always be moving from a higher to lower point with only the point(s) moved to used. To make it easier to follow, the larger number rolled is denoted first. In some situations where the smaller number rolled is forced, it will be presented first. An example: being on the BAR with a roll of 52 with the 5-point made and the 2-point open.

Abbreviations used are CB - Closed Board, EF - Entry Failure, NP - No Play Possible, x - opponents piece was hit, 5^2 - superscribe denotes 2 or more pieces moving to the same point; this example has 2 pieces moving to the 5 point. In the doubling positions, Bill will be the dark checkers and Ray the light and are shown from Bill Robertie's side of the board. Study those first before going through the games.
