

High-Noon Shoot Out Event Jack Kissane vs Nack Ballard 9 Point Match

The HBC Newsletter presents three 9-point matches from a High-Noon Shoot Out Event, 1987 Nevada State Championships. The first is between Jack Kissane and Nack Ballard.

Instructions: You will need a backgammon board to follow along. The board is numbered 1 to 24 based on the view of the player on roll. Each player will always be moving from a higher to lower point with only the point(s) moved used. The home portion of the board is numbered 1 thru 6. Bearing off is noted as moving to the zero (0) point. To make it easier to follow, the larger number rolled is noted first. In some situations where the smaller number rolled is forced, it will be presented first. An example: being on the BAR with a roll of 5-2 with the 5-point made and the 2-point open.

Abbreviations used:

Closed Board(CB), Entry Failure(EF), Misplay(MP), No Play Possible(NP), opponent's piece was hit(x), superscript(5²) denotes 2 or more pieces moving to the same point; this example has 2 pieces moving to the 5 point.

In the doubling positions, Jack is the dark checkers, Nack the light checkers and the positions are shown from Jack's side of the board. Study the doubling positions first before going through the game.










HBC Club Championship

All players now playing with the Hoosier Backgammon Club are competing to become 1991 HBC Club All players who win PLAYER of the Champion. Month honor or finish in the Top Ten Players of the Year will win a spot. The 12 players who win Player of the Month will start in the round of 32 and the 10 players who finish in the Top Ten enter the grid at the round of 16. The format will be single elimination with 13-point matches. Since some players will be eligible more than once, the first two rounds will be drawn in the most fair and equitable manner. Besides winning a trophy, the champion will receive \$200 cash. This is in addition to the awards given to the Top Player of the Year and the Top Ten Players of the Year.
