9-Point Match, Black(3), White(4)

Black to Play 6-5?
White owns a 2 -cube.


In addition to owning the cube, blockade. White has a 21 pip lead in the race. If we play safe here with 8 . 2, 7-2, we will be ahead in crossovers and should start bearing off first. In 100 trials, this play achieved only a $48 \%$ win ratio and a net loss of 4 points. The reason for this low yield is obvious considering the advance nature of White's inner board.
There is a play that will turn White's racing edge against him. What about playing 8-3x, 7-1? What about playing 8-3x, $7-1$ ? that this is a money game. After
This play sends White to the rail, 100 games, Black won an while maintaining the 5 -point astonishing 92 points!

Should White fail to enter with his next roll, Black will be in excellent shape indeed. If White rolls any 3 other than 6-3, Black will be able to hit the outfield blot when it comes into range. In 100 trials, Black won 69\% including 8 gammons. On the down side, of the 31 losses, 3 were gammons. To fully appreciate the results of the 100 games played out, lets assume that this is a money game. After

## High-Noon Shoot Out Event Jack Kissane vs Kent Goulding 9 Point Match

The HBC Newsletter presents three 9-point matches from a High-Noon Shoot Out Event, 1987 Nevada State Championships. The third is Jack Kissane versus Kent Goulding.

Instructions: You will need a backgammon board to follow along. The board is numbered 1 to 24 based on the view of the player on roll. Each player will always be moving from a higher to lower point with only the point(s) moved to used. The home portion of the board is numbered 1 thru 6 . Bearing off is noted as moving to the zero ( 0 ) point. To make it easier to follow, the larger number rolled is noted first. In some situations where the smaller number rolled is forced, it will be presented first. An example: being on the BAR with a roll of 5-2 with the 5 -point made and the 2 -point open.

Abbreviations used: Closed Board(CB), Entry Failure(EF), Misplay(MP), No Play Possible(NP), opponent's piece was hit (x), superscript( $5^{2}$ ) denotes 2 or more pieces moving to a point; this example has 2 pieces moving to the 5 point.

In the doubling positions, Jack is the dark checkers and Kent the light. The positions are shown from Jack's side of the board; study them first before going through the games.
