June Contest Results

The contest entailed picking the best play from the conditions that follow. After your opponent rolls 4-3 for the opening roll and plays 24-20, 13-10 you roll 4-1. Pick the best move from the 4 plays below:

a) 13-9, 24-23

b) 13-9, 6-5x

c) 24-20, 6-5x

d) 6-5x-1x.

Editors note: Mr Jim Curtis has been entertaining us for years with his letters. When we presented the contest in the June 1994 newsletter, he entered with another letter which we reprint here with permission.

I have spent many hours studying the position set out in the June newsletter and the four (4) plays identified therein. After much consternation, I believe item (c) 24-20, 6-5x is the proper play.

Obviously hitting two (2) checkers (d) was my first nclination. Although this leaves the least shots, it

seems to do very little for my game.

The non-hit play (a) has the advantage of duplicating fours all over the board. However, it does very little to promote my game and probably allows my opponent to do something good on one side of the board or the other. I see no advantage to allowing the opponent to have full use of his roll. I would appreciate a list of all contestants that make this selection. I will have a private chouette for them at my house.

Schizophrenics would probably choose the ambivalent offense/defense move in selection (b). Although slightly safer than my choice, it does make 3-6 good for the opponent and still leaves 2 and perhaps 3 of my checkers on my opponents one-point when I am hit.

My play opens me up to some disastrous rolls by my opponent, 5-1, 5-3, double 1's, 3's, 4's and 5's. If I don't respond well to those eight (8) rolls, I will drop (maybe). On the other hand, nine (9) rolls, all 6's, except 5-6, do not help my opponent and actually put him at a distinct disadvantage. I do not even consider 5-6 particularly harmful. Actually, if I'm not hit, I would probably be inclined to double and take my gammon when the fool accepts. Of the seventeen (17) rolls not previously mentioned, I have the advantage of fighting for one or both of the five points, which are probably the most important open points.

Actually all the above logic is merely rationalization. I looked at which play was going to produce the most action, and then tried to figure how I was going to justify it. I'm sure one realizes this is how I play the game, so please don't let my secret out.
