

If Tomorrow Never Comes

Position One. Money Game, Black to play 3-1?




To hit or not is a frequent decision in backgammon. The gains from hitting are many and well known, for example: improvement in racing chances and taking away opponent's options next turn. Downsides include loss of an asset (for example, an anchor) and the threat of getting one's own checkers sent back. The latter concern is an issue in Position 1.

Many players would fail to hit here with the rationale *I'll wait until I've improved my motheaten board; then I'll hit.* The problem here is that White may never leave that future shot and when s/he does, Black might miss it.

According to Snowie rollouts, the best non-hitting plays (13/10, 8/7 or 13/10, 6/5) are *Whoppers*, giving up 0.11 units of cubeless equity. Although minimizing gammon risks, these plays win only about 29% of games compared to over 36% for the best choice. And what is that **best** choice? Possibly surprising the purists who are steeled in avoiding stacking the acepoint, 13/12x, 4/1 is considerably better than 13/12x/9 by 0.07 units of cubeless equity. Mostly this comes from 7% fewer gammon losses, but lifting also wins nearly

2% more games from 35% to 37%.


Position Two. Money, Black to play 3-1?

How much do we need to change Position 1 in order for it to be correct to leave that blot alone? Position 2 is such an example. The primary reason that hitting is now incorrect is the blot on the 8-point. Even when Black lifts 4/1, the extra blot and loss of the blocking point give White too many gammons. Another reason to play safe is Black's improved racing equity. The combination of two pips and two extra crossovers improve Black's racing chances by nearly 4% over Position 1. The correct play is 13/10, 6/5 which is better than 13/12x, 4/1 by a whopping 0.13 equity units. The hitting play loses 1% more games and 13% more gammons than the safe play.

Position Three. Money Game, Black to play 4-1?

In contrast to the previous situation, hitting in Position 3 is again correct. Covering 8/4 leaves Black with a 4-point board and if White fans Black has excellent prospects of turning it into a five pointer. Once again failing to hit is a blunder, worse by 0.12 cubeless equity units. The extra blots are scary, and when Black's plan fails the
