Rating Intermediate Players

Kent Goulding has expanded the International Rating System to include Intermediate division play. This is a great addition to backgammon. One benefit will be that when enough data from tournaments has been collected, the system can help determine players eligibility. New intermediate players will start at 1400 instead of 1500. This will, of course, double the work load on Kent and staff. Kent has already invested a large portion of his time and money into the rating system. It is time, in fact overdue, that the directors and players help. The directors can help by including the players' ID numbers on the first round of all draw sheets and use complete names - not nicknames or abbreviations. The players can help finance. A rating fee of \$1.00 can be collected at each tournament for any division that is to be rated. The director and staff can collect the money at registration and send it in with the draw sheet.

The Hoosier Backgammon Club will send in the Intermediate results with \$49 from the 38th INDIANA Open (April, 1990) and \$88 with the Open and Intermediate results of the National Labor Day Backgammon Tournament. A new rating list, July 1990, is available from HBC or Kent Goulding for \$10; 9201 Marseille Drive, Potomac, MD 20854.


Reno Masters Tournament Joe Sylvester vs Ed OLaughlin 21 Point Match


The **HBC Newsletter** presents the first 3 games of a match from the Masters Event at the Reno Tournament between Joe Sylvester and Ed OLaughlin.


Instructions: You will need a backgammon board to follow along. The board is numbered 1 to 24 with all points numbered based on the view of the player on roll. The home portion of the board is numbered 1-6. Bearing off is denoted as moving to the 0 'zero' point. Each player will always be moving from a higher to lower point with only the point(s) moved to used. To make it easier to follow, the larger number rolled is denoted first. In some situations where the smaller number rolled is forced, it will be presented first. An example: being on the BAR with a roll of 52 with the 5-point made and the 2-point open.


Abbreviations used are CB - Closed Board, EF - Entry Failure, NP - No Play Possible, x - opponents piece was hit, 5^2 - superscribe denotes 2 or more pieces moving to the same point; this example has 2 pieces moving to the 5 point.


In the doubling positions, Joe is the dark checkers and Ed the light checkers and are shown from Joe's side of the board. Study the doubling positions first before going through the games.


