Black is facing a better opponent and is behind. Black has not played poorly but still finds himself behind. Sometimes players push the panic button when in this situation, grabbing at anything that might turn the tide. But this strategy usually does not work. In this position, Black has a 2-1 to play.

Black hit the checker on the 10-point. Making the 5 -point is clearly better. First, the hitting play exposes 2 blots in which one of them gets hit with 12 numbers and any hit puts Black in a hopeless position. A good rule when hitting is to have an equal home board. Black only has a 1-point home board versus White's 3-point home board.

Making the 5 -point makes a 4 -point prime and 4-point primes can win games. You can't make a 5 -point prime without making a 4 -point prime first. White surely does not want 2 checkers behind a 4or 5 -point prime, so White will most likely be moving the blot on the 10 -point on his next move. You can win with only one checker primed.

The entry fee will be $\$ 25$. Re-enties will be allowed to fill a 32-player bracket. The fee for re-entries for each person will be $\$ 20, \$ 15, \$ 10, \$ 5$ and $\$ 0$ in order to fill bracket. Format: Single elimination with consolation. A minimum of 4 rounds will be held on Saturday to ensure that only a few participants need to return on Sunday. Match length will be 9 -points on Saturday and 11-points on Sunday.

The Louisville Backgammon Club will add $\$ 200$ to each tournament prize pool.
The prize will be divided as follows: 1st... $40 \%$ 2nd... $20 \%$, and the two consolation finalists will also receive $20 \%$ each.

If sufficient interest exists, an Intermediate Division will be run with a $\$ 25$ entry fee, but probably without re-entries.
