





9-Point Match, White - 2, Black - 1 Cube Action?

This position occurred in the finals of the doubles at the **Lucien Bariere Open** which was held in Enghien-les-Bains, France from October 15-19 of this year. **Emil Mortuk** and I were Black playing against **Jan Bloxham** and **Judy Olsen** of Denmark.

After hitting a lucky shot in the bearoff we now had to decide whether or not to redouble. The first step is to figure out what they need to take at this score. Using the Woolsey-Heinrich match equity chart, if they drop they trail 3-2 to 9 which is 44%; take and lose puts them down 5-2 which is 30%; take and win puts them up 6-1 with 80% match equity. So they're risking 14% to gain 36% which means their takepoint is 28%, 3% higher than for money.

You also need to look at our takepoint on a potential 8-cube. If we drop we're down 1-6 to 9 which is 20%; take and lose loses the match; take and win wins the match. So we need 20% to take a recube to 8, 5% less than for money. This roughly translates to their needing around 24.5% cubeless chances in order take the cube. This 24.5% figure is arrived at assuming 60% efficiency on their recube $(28\% - 28\% \times 20\% \times 0.6)$.

So the bottomline is that they need a little bit more to take at this score than for money and that we should therefore redouble a little sooner than normal.

For money, the correct cube action in this position is no redouble and take. The reason is that even when you close out their last checker and place your spares perfectly on the 6, 5 and 4 points, you only lose your market by a tiny amount. The most likely sequence is for you to close your opponent out but with your 3 spares a bit further advanced than you'd like.

Because their takepoint is a little higher than for money, my partner and I thought we should redouble now. A Snowie rollout says we were wrong and that redoubling lowers our match winning chances from 53.44% to 52.64%.

The results show our side to be 70.6% -29.4% cubeless favorites, a full 5% above their cubeless takepoint. That's too far away from their takepoint to redouble in a position which isn't really that volatile. We should have waited.

Waiting has one other advantage: many players would still take after we close them out and position our spares perfectly anyway!

No redouble: 53.44% +/- 0.20% Redouble and take: 52.64% +/- 0.26% Redouble and pass: 55.85%
